Screenplay finalists will be announced on June 7th, 2021 with winners being revealed in both feature and short categories on June 15th, 2021.

While Desertscape International Film Festival: Year Three will pride itself on a wonderfully diverse slate of films and screenplays of multiple genres, programmers promise a variety of several other noteworthy film-centric activities and events as well. **Included**; <u>Filmmaker Q&A's</u>, <u>storyteller panels</u>, a <u>live script read</u>, <u>VR stations</u>, a <u>3D movie alley</u>, a <u>16mm pop-up theater</u>, <u>live music</u>, <u>food</u>, an <u>opening night party</u>, and a <u>closing night Awards Gala</u>.

But the cinematic greatness doesn't stop there. Desertscape will have special guests on hand. Actor/filmmaker **Colin Cunningham** ("<u>Falling Skies</u>," "<u>Preacher</u>," "<u>Centigrade</u>," and more) will be joining the festivities as a Desertscape Jury member. He'll also be part of an informative storytelling panel. Also making a grand appearance; Professional screenwriter **Jeff Robison** ("<u>The Scent of Rain of Lightning</u>," "<u>Rudderless</u>.") Robison, too, will serve on the Jury.

Additionally, this veteran writer will open the festival with an <u>optional screenwriting clinic</u> as well as host a <u>special screening of the underrated 2014 music-tinged father/son story, "**Rudderless**" starring Billy Crudup. Cunningham and Robison have plenty of insight on the business and both will engage Desertscape attendees by way of their own brand of infectious charm.</u>
